

Hercules Wimbledon Athletic Club's IAAF World and Commonwealth Youth Games medallist Rechmial Miller made a superb start to his outdoor season with an impressive 100m victory at Lee Valley while fellow club member Dwayne Cowan smashed two club records in the USA, reports Tom Pollak.

SPRINTERS SHOW FINE FORM AT HOME AND ABROAD

Miller, who took silver in Samoa and bronze in Columbia over 100 metres in the Commonwealth and World Youth Championships last summer, stormed to victory in 10.48 seconds, the fastest time by a British teenager this year. His time was significantly faster than the time he achieved in his opening 100m race last summer - 10.66, also at Lee Valley. Miller, 17, winner of the under 20 60m silver medal in the England indoor championships in Sheffield in January, boosted his hopes of representing Britain in the IAAF World Junior Championships in Poland in July. His time was only three-hundredths of a second outside the World Championships qualifying time. He has a best of 10.35 set at the Bedford International Games last May which ranked him fourth under 20 100m runner in the UK in 2015.

"Rechmial has been training and racing hard throughout the winter," said his dad Paul, himself a former Surrey 100m sprint champion. "He's stronger and fitter than he was this time last year and on this form he should make the World Championships."

Across the Pond, Cowan also showed stunning form at the NTC/Pure Athletics Spring Invitational Meeting at Clermont. He finished second in his 400m race in 46.17 to eclipse his previous club record of 46.25 to post a big lifetime best and, more significantly, clock a much faster time than international one lap runners and Rio team contenders Nigel Levine and Conrad Williams who clocked slower 46.50 and 46.70, respectively, at the same meeting. Cowan, 31, boosted his hopes of representing Britain in either the Rio Olympics or the European Championships as only one British one-lap runner has posted a faster time this year. But, he needs to take almost half-a-second off his best time to achieve the Euro qualifying standard of 45.70 and go even faster, 45.40, to gain consideration for Rio. To underline the form he is in, though, he also broke his club 200m record of 21.08 at the same meeting by clocking 21.01. He is the current South of England senior men's 200m champion. Also in the States, Hercules Wimbledon's Max Mondelli showed good form in the Virginia Challenge Meeting in Charlottesville finishing second in his 200m race in 21.65 and fifth in his 100m in 10.88.

Two other Hercules Wimbledon youngsters to also show impressive form at Lee Valley were Chad Miller and Zipporah Golding. The younger Miller brother, 16, clocked a personal best 100m of 11.15 to improve on the 11.18 he clocked at the Hercules Wimbledon Young Athlete Open Meeting last month. He ranks eighth in the UK for his age group this year. Golding, 12, posted a lifetime best of 13.37 for 100m, a time which ranks her second in the UK for her age group this year.

Hercules Wimbledon's Jonathan Cornish completed a hat-trick of wins when he beat a 1177-strong field to win the Bushy Park 5km parkrun on Saturday. He clocked 15:44 to win by exactly a minute. It was his fifth win in the event since making his debut in June last year. Hercules Wimbledon runners packed well on Wimbledon Common filling three of the top four places with Richard McDowell, Jonny Earl and Finn Johnson finishing second, third and fourth in 17:32, 17:38 and 17:45, respectively. Lisa Thomas posted the top women's agegraded performance in finishing third in the women's race in 21:03. Twenty-six Hercules Wimbledon runners were among the 373 finishers.

Hercules Wimbledon youngsters took the individual honours in the Wimbledon Park junior 2km parkrun on Sunday. Teenager Sacha Ormiston headed home the 118-strong field to win in 7:50 to post his sixth win in the event since his debut appearance in February last year. He was just 10 seconds outside his best time. Selma Hegvold was third and first girl in a personal best of 8:31. She shaved three seconds off her previous best set in February. It was her first win since October last year. Sonny Peterson also clocked a personal best in finishing fifth in 8:50 with Cate Coverley ninth and third girl in 9:15 on her debut appearance. Rob Tuer was runner-up out of 259 runners in Brockwell Park in a personal best of 17:16. His previous best was 17:44 on his debut appearance back in August 2011. Chris Ore was third out of 219 finishers in Burgess Park in 17:19.

Hercules Wimbledon's Andrew Penney just missed out on an individual medal when he finished fourth in the longest race of his life, the Richmond half-marathon, in 1:14:38. Penney, 24, missed out by just 20 seconds on third place. His previous longest race was less than half the distance, 10km.

Hercules Wimbledon athletes of all ages face a busy few days. The youngsters are involved in the opening Ebbisham Boys League meeting at Stompond Lane, Walton on Sunday with the senior runners competing in the second Surrey Road League race over 10km at Nonsuch Park, Cheam, starting at 9.30am. Older club athletes are in action in the opening Southern Veterans League meeting at Kingsmeadow Stadium, starting at 6.30pm and then, both men's and women's track and field teams take part in the opening Rosenheim League East Division match of the season at Battersea Park's Millennium Arena, next Wednesday (May 11th) starting at 6.45pm.

SHEILA WEATHERS THE STORM IN MORE WAYS THAN ONE

What a night it was on the occasion of the HW Open meeting held on Wednesday last week. Weatherwise: just take a look at a report from the local Guardian newspaper,

'Hail has been "bucketing from the skies" above Wandsworth this evening.

Luke Wretham, 26, who lives in Tilehurst Road, Earlsfield, said: "I have never seen weather like this in late April in all my years.

"Thunder was booming just after 8pm followed by lightning, which you rarely see in London."

The marketing executive added: "I was astounded. It was bucketing from the skies.

"My housemate was out for a run and arrived back looking like a wet sock."

Jonathan Wood was walking up Magdalen Road, Earlsfield, when he was caught in the snow. The analyst said: "I couldn't believe my eyes.

"Snow in April? Madness!"

Problems had already been faced by meeting organiser Sheila White when during the days prior to the event, one-by-one of the planned officials and helpers decided that they had other matters to deal with and just hours prior to the meeting commencing, doubts were made as to whether it could take place.

However, last-minute replacements stepped in and all was okay and all that was left to contend with were the 'stair rods' belting down for the well-attended 800m races and late into the night Richard Weston locked the gates from the park behind him.

Talking of the London Marathon, Tom Pollak interviewed David Grima soon after the race

"Claire was really pleased with her run. She had said after last year's race that she felt 2.42 was achievable next time and I was willing to have a crack at that time to, so we set about our training with a goal marathon pace of 6.10m/m in mind.

"We were also really hoping to run together all the way, but accepted that in the marathon everyone has ups and downs at different time. I was comfortable until 14 miles but then I felt the familiar twinge of calf cramp and being fully aware that we had time to spare, decided to ease off which is when Claire pulled away. She was ably guided to the finish by Ben Noad, for which she was massively grateful. By all accounts he did a tremendous job keeping her on track, fetching drinks and general light entertainment! She also couldn't believe quite how many people he knew along the way!

"I was pleased to only lose a minute in the end. The cramps, which I am familiar with, were worse than they have been in my last few marathons, but I knew if I could get through the Docklands I can generally finish the last few miles off pretty well.

"It was great to come over the finish and see a good bunch of HW team mates had all had good runs".
